The Shooters

REACH Legends 2012 16u & 17u 6'4" 2012 shooting guard Sherrod Dorsey-Walker- The top shooting guard in Michigan's 2012 class isn't afraid to rebound. He was a top three rebounder in each of the games I watched him play including a game against the Mustangs where he needed to stick his nose in the trenches.

Mustangs 16u 2012 6'2" shooting guard Bryn Forbes- He put up 23-points in the championship game but before he was banging threes in the finale' he was getting loose in pool play. Forbes has been known as a quality catch and shoot guard but although not a great athlete he finishes on the break with either hand consistently and he works hard. One of those kids that's better from month to month.

Camp Darryl 17u 2011 6'5" shooting guard Daequan Mitchell- A Kalamazoo Promise kid, the lefty knocked down three-pointers and added athleticism to a solid skill set. Don't go asleep on the other Kalamazoo high school as this Loy Norrix kid has more than a shot. Producing through July will be his key and the Promise will be more than a bargaining tool when it comes to scholarships.

Emerging in Michigan
